The Migration Policy Institute has produced a set of 30 fact sheets that provide a sociodemographic sketch of foreign- and U.S.-born parents with young children (ages 0 to 8) in select U.S. states, based on Migration Policy Institute analysis of U.S. Census Bureau American Community Survey data. They accompany a national report, [*Serving Immigrant Families Through Two-Generation Programs: Identifying Family Needs and Responsive Program Approaches*](#), that examines the success of a select number of two-generation programs aimed at immigrants and refugees—who comprise almost one-quarter of all parents with young children in the United States.
